

FORMER WENONA WOMAN DIES

MRS. JOHN GARVIN
CALLED BY DEATH IN
STREATOR HOSPITAL FRIDAY

WENONA—(Special)—Mrs. John Garvin, a former Wenona resident, passed away in St. Mary's hospital of Streator at 12:30 p. m., Friday, having been a patient since suffering a stroke, Nov. 6. She remained unconscious until her death.

Funeral services will be held in St. John's Methodist Church at Wenona, Monday at 1:30 p. m. with Rev. Harry Dovenspike officiating. Friends may call at the Thierry Funeral Home at Wenona after 3:30 p. m., Sunday. Burial will be in Hope cemetery at Lstant.

Mrs. Garvin was born at Franklin Grove, Ill., Jan. 8, 1881, daughter of Silas and Savanah (Dumbauld) Kregor. The former Pearl Kregor married John Garvin at Bloomington, Aug. 6, 1903. After their marriage, the couple farmed north of Wenona until 1957, when they moved to Santa Monica, California.

They had returned to Wenona to visit, Mrs. Garvin becoming ill two weeks after they arrived.
